"Financials of Supply Chain Risk Management (FSCRM)"

Topics: On the one hand, managing risks in supply chains has emerged as an important issue in supply chain management. This research area which is known before as Enterprise Risk Management (ERM) has become familiar as supply chain risk management (SCRM). The components of SCRM may again be differentially defined in terms of the subdivision of the particular strands, although most definitions would encompass the following: (1) Risk identification and modeling, (2) Risk Analysis, Assessment and Impact, (3) Risk Management and implementation; and (4) Risk Monitoring and Evaluation. In the other hand, Supply Chain Finance (SCF) arrangements aim to add value by taking a cooperative approach to financing in the supply chain. SCF has recently enjoyed considerable attention from industry, and providers of capital and technology are investing in platforms to facilitate new applications. Very recently, some theoretical and empirical studies on the topic have been published. Current SCF applications can be calibrated to better facilitate the continuity of valuable operations of supply chains, rather than only extracting maximum financial opportunities. This session focuses (1) to integrate the new developments, issues and challenges about all components of SCRM, and particularly of ERM; (2) to presents last development in financial risk management, SCF and reverse factoring. The session will cover all aspects of theoretical developments and practical applications, such as methodologies, techniques, studies, and experiences in decision making related to enterprise risk management in the context of finance management and supply chains.
